We believe that Mr. Weed has been a powerful influence in the development of a strong regional architecture in this part of the country. We consider him to be a competent designer - his work evidencing an exceptionally high standard of design throughout a long period of years. His work is in tune with Florida, with the people, the climate, and the surroundings. He has been nationally recognized for many years because of this consistent quality and for the original and often daring solutions of various projects. He also has always maintained a very high design quality. In recent years his work shows, in carefully thought out construction detail, his understanding of architectural construction values. The Miami Parking Garage and the new Five-Fifty Building we believe are outstanding examples. His successful design experiments and new uses of construction materials and systems, with the economies of buildings always in mind, have notably contributed to the advancement of his profession.

Also, he has been a delegate for this chapter and for the state association to many American Institute of Architects conventions, and has headed many committees for these organizations. In 1950 he served on the AIA Committee for Expansion of Research Facilities, and is at present on the Committee of International Relations for 1951.

During Mr. Weed's practice in Florida, he has taken an extremely active interest in civic affairs. Immediately following World War II, Mr. Weed served as Director on the Greater Miami Emergency Housing Executive Committee, which was served to speed the veterans housing program for the benefit of those returning from the war. His work on this committee aided greatly the realization of housing so badly needed.

Mr. Weed served his country in two World Wars, giving up routine practice to make an architect's contribution as a planner in the Army Air Force. His work has been recognized by the Air Force.





During the past two years Mr. Weed has continued his activities for the Air Force which has resulted in the master planning of a number of installations in the United States and its dependencies. Unfortunately much of this information is restricted and additional details cannot be given. The two large department stores for Burdine's, Inc. and the Jai Alai Fronton at Dania are not sufficiently completed for adequate photographs to be obtained. The Fleet Sonar School at Key West is nearing completion and is scheduled for early publication in ARCHITECTURAL FORUM.

In addition, Mr. Weed has kept up his active contribution to the profession through memberships in civic and national groups of associated interests. He is still active on the City of Miami Board of Appeals of the Building Division. The work of the Building Code Revision Committee has been completed and is awaiting decision by the City Commission. He is serving on advisory committees to the Dade County Board of Public Instruction regarding Vocational Education, and Heating and Ventilating of School Buildings. He continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of the Florida Gulf Coast Art Center and is on the Advisory Board of the International Scholarship Committee of the University of Miami. He has served on numerous panels for the discussion of problems relative to architecture and the building industry in the past two years. Among these are the forum conducted by ARCHITECTURAL FORUM on matters concerning architect-owner relations, and the Producers Council Round Table in Washington last June.

He has served on numerous juries for architectural awards, notably for the National Junior Chamber of Commerce Building, held in Colorado Springs, and has been himself the recipient of the Oscar Dooly award by the Lowe Gallery of the University of Miami, for a residence in Jamaica. He has also served as delegate to two meetings of the Pan American Congress of Architects.

He also has always maintained a very high design quality. In recent years his work shows, in carefully thought out construction detail, his understanding of architectural construction values. The Miami Parking Garage, the Five-Fifty Building, The First National Bank of Miami, and Sears, Roebuck and Co., Tampa Store, we believe are outstanding examples. His successful design experiments and new uses of construction materials and systems, with the economies of buildings always in mind, have notably contributed to the advancement of his profession.

Mr. Weed has taken the lead in the use of concrete in building construction; notable examples would be the use of a concrete hip plate roof construction on a 125 ft. simple span for the Sears, Roebuck and Co. Store in Tampa, Florida, and the use of a hip plate roof construction on a 110 ft. cantilever span for the National Airlines Hangar Building in Miami, Florida. It should also be noted that in the Sears, Roebuck Store in Tampa the second floor was hung from the roof construction so that the first floor might be clear of columns.

In 1949, Mr. Weed designed a flat slab parking garage, and in 1951, used a similar construction for the Five-Fifty Building. In the Five-Fifty Building, he designed precast wall panels that were hung from the ends of the concrete slab to form the building's exterior walls.

Mr. Weed has continually pioneered in the use and development of quartz, gravel and tile-face light-weight precast panels for the buildings he has designed in South Florida. His work has not been limited to concrete design, but a unique light structural steel system was created by him in the design of the National Airlines Office Building.

In 1956, he was Treasurer of the FAA Convention here in Miami.



ROBERT LAW WEED DIES

Architect Was Chief Designer of University of Miami

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 9—Robert Law Weed, Miami architect and chief designer of the University of Miami, died here Sunday at his home. He was 64 years old.

A graduate of Carnegie Institute of Technology, Mr. Weed came to Miami in 1919 after service in World War I as an officer with the Coast Artillery. In 1947 after years of designing mostly private residences he was given a free hand in planning the master design of the University of Miami campus.

He designed and saw completed the \$842,000 Memorial Classroom Building which set the trend for architecture on the campus.

Some of Mr. Weed's recent buildings here include the First National Bank, the Northside Shopping Center, the Dania Jai-Alai Fronton and The Miami News Building.
