Dear Mr. O'Connor:

With reference to Messrs. Fitch Haskell and Alfred Rea:

By now you should have received official notice of the termination of the memberships of these former members for the non-payment of Institute dues. This termination applies to their chapter memberships as well as to their Institute memberships.
