

DIGEST OF CAREER AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Norma Merrick Sklarek

Los Angeles

California

In the three decades since graduation from Columbia University School of Architecture the nominee has devoted her energies to seeking and attaining improved methods of architectural practice. Her work has been on low cost but high quality large building projects and complexes such as multi-level enclosed mall shopping centers, office buildings, hospitals, high-rise apartments and hotels—projects which often included parking structures, pedestrian malls and plazas. These architectural works have been located throughout the United States as well as in foreign countries and have entailed the knowledge and coordination of sophisticated building and mechanical systems for climates and conditions as diverse as the frigid weather found in Minnesota to the floods, landslides and seismic conditions found in California.

Always questioning, never blindly following tradition, are attitudes natural to the nominee and which have resulted in her establishment of new office practice standards appropriate for very large projects—standards which, though formulated and developed for Gruen Associates, have been used and copied by many other firms. The nominee's professional personality added a human dimension to efficiency, expertise and overwhelming desire for excellence which were guiding principles.

This was always evident by her constant overseeing the professional development of co-workers and subordinates, tutoring, training and encouraging them. Her influence extended beyond the walls of her office through seminars and mock exams sponsored by the SCC/AIA for design examination candidates for registration and also through several years of teaching on the faculty in UCLA's master of architecture program.

Services to the architectural profession through extensive AIA involvement and through serving as a Commissioner on the California State Board of Architectural Examiners have meshed with the nominee's professional work and her work in education. Besides the obvious benefits that have resulted to young architectural aspirants, the nominee's volunteer efforts have been involved with the NAAB accreditation process of three new architecture schools in Southern California—and of vital interest to California architects—have succeeded in having architecture continue as a licensed profession in California by influencing the state government to restore funding for the Board of Architectural Examiners.
