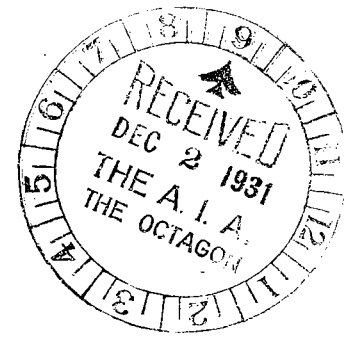

Dear Mr. Wheelock:

This will acknowledge your letter of June 8th, making application for retirement and election as a Member Emeritus of The Institute.

From your letter it appears that you are eligible to be placed on the retired list, with one exception.

The By-laws provide that to be retired a member must have been "in good standing in The Institute for not less than fifteen successive years immediately preceding the date of his application for retirement".

It appears from the record that your membership was under suspension for the non-payment of Institute dues for the period of December 31, 1936 to January 13, 1937.

However, the By-laws also provide that "Under exceptional conditions and circumstances in any individual case, The Board may lessen the requirement of the period of good standing".

Therefore, if you will write a supplementary letter setting forth any conditions and circumstances which The Board could consider as a basis for applying the exception to your case, we shall be glad to submit it, with your application, to The Board at its meeting in November.
