Designer of Office Buildings Worked on U.N. Structure

Arvin Shaw 3d, a well-known architect who designed many office buildings in this city and elsewhere, died yesterday at Roosevelt Hospital after a short illness. He was 57 years old and lived at 150 East 65th te Street until last fall, when he

moved to Sagaponack, L.I.
Mr. Shaw designed the 38story structure at 666 Fifth Avenue, the 39-story headquarters of the First National City
Bank at 399 Park Avenue, the
23-story Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company Building at 4 New York Plaza and the fiveblock-long Department of Motor Vehicles Building in Albany.

He also worked on the design

He also worked on the design of the United Nations complex tunder Wallace K. Harrison. Most recently he was the design partner in charge of the sign partner in charge of the new St. John's University Law Carson & Lundin here in 1957. bus Circle.
