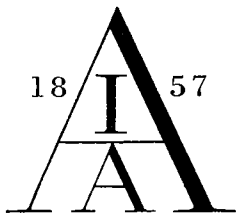

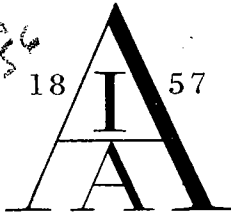

p. 255 The author's contribution, when the pen is mightier than the machine tool, is to chronicle events as he has experienced them, in more than a half century of railroading, or to secure information from correspondents all over the world. Part of the author's experience in this genre of miniature railways has been to fabricate model live steamers; and without claiming a place in the gallery itself, it may not perhaps be inapposite to set down such experiences.

The author was inspired to work on his own live steamer when he first encountered Albert S. Campbell in 1900. Mr. Campbell was doing business in Monticello, New York, and it was about this time the old New York Central and Hudson River Railroad produced its interesting No. 2900 series of Atlantic type locomotives. The picture and drawings of the engine being available in the now defunct Railway & Locomotive Engineering Magazine of New York, a start was made on a model of No. 2990. A budding draftsman, the author utilized his skills in devising the necessary drawings for a one-inch scale steam locomotive.

Wheel castings were purchased from Mr. Campbell and patterns made for other parts. Under guidance of friendly machinists, the engine began to take shape. It is sad to reflect that No. 2990 was never completed for steam trials; but it was advanced enough to satisfy the acquisitive instincts of an unscrupulous engine fancier. It vanished in 1923 without a trace.

In 1946 a 9-inch-gauge, 2 inch scale American-type live steam locomotive was undertaken. This model, which took two years to

p. 257 complete, followed no specific prototype but was something of a composite of the features which had long appealed to the author. Movies of the first day's steam trials are all that remain, for the little live steamer was sold to another enthusiast.
