1943-1945 Tuck and Kendall, Inc., Norfolk, Va. - Supervising Electrical Engineer on negotiated and bid electrical work in Norfolk area for U.S. Engineers and Navy Y. & Docks. Work included airport lighting system at East Field, Naval Operating Base, Norfolk, and Naval Air Station, Elizabeth City, N.C.; design and installation of electrical system for training seamen at the Destroyer Escort School, N.O.B., Norfolk; installation of electrical system on 3 concrete piers, N.O.B., Norfolk, including design and installation of a temporary 13KV primary O.H. feeder, 300 KVA 13KV/440V/220V substation and 250HP 440V Jetting pump for pile driving. These poles were set by dynamiting the mud below them, the site being a mud berm extending out into the Elizabeth River. Design and installation of an overhead electric distribution system for a trailer camp, Norfolk; installation of additions and changes to primary distribution system, Army Depot, Norfolk. Design and installation of electrical system for a foundry, Norfolk, Va.

We operate as engineers and general contractors, offering a complete construction service: excavation, foundations, piling, steel erection, all masonry, concrete work, carpentry, lathing and plastering are routinely performed by our firm without subcontracts.
